Transfer Effectiveness Report

This report may help you evaluate students transferring from your institution to Texas State in the fall 2005 semester. Enrollment, academic performance, and retention figures are reported by ethnicity, gender, college, decision semester credit hours (SCH), and decision GPA. The column headings of the report are as follows:

- ◆ The number (N) of first-time transfer students enrolled at Texas State in fall 2005 from your two-year college.
- ◆ Percentage (%) of first-time transfer students by ethnicity, gender, Texas State college of study, decision SCH, and decision GPA.
- ◆ SCH is the average number of Semester Credit Hours earned during the first academic year (fall and spring) at Texas State by transfer students. For students who attended Texas State only in the fall semester, the fall SCH was used in the average. Students withdrawing from Texas State before the end of a semester were excluded from the averages; however, students failing all classes were included in the average as zero SCH.
- ◆ GPA is the Grade Point Average earned during the first academic year by transfer students (calculated on a 4.0 scale). For students who attended Texas State only in the fall semester, the fall GPA was included in the average. Students withdrawing from Texas State before the end of a semester were excluded from the average; however, if a student failed all classes, a zero GPA was included in the average.
- ◆ Continue is the percentage of transfer students who continued enrollment at Texas State in the fall 2006 semester. This is determined by dividing the number who returned at the beginning of the fall 2006 semester by the number first enrolled at the beginning of fall 2005.

In the right side of the table, "All 2-Year College Students After 1 Year at Texas State" provides the overall performance of transfers from Texas two-year colleges who first attended Texas State in fall 2005; your students are shown in the left side of the table for comparison.
