COLLEGE PRESIDENT:
QUALIFICATIONS AND DUTIES

(LOCAL)

The College President shall be the chief executive officer of the College District; authority shall be delegated to the College President by the Board. The College President's authority and responsibilities shall include, but not be limited to, the following duties:

1. Serve as the chief interpreter of the College District's objectives and activities to the community. Conversely, the President shall serve as spokesman for the community to the College District personnel.
2. Attend all meetings of the Board, unless excused from attendance.
3. Act as the professional advisor to the Board in all matters pertaining to the educational, business and fiscal, and all other policies for organization and operation of the College District. Be governed by Board policies and regulations in the operation of the District.
4. Have all personnel employed by the College District ultimately responsible to the College President. Employ or discharge employees of the institution as provided by Board policy. Have the authority to adjust the administrative organization and make any adjustments in personnel assignments, offices, titles, and duties as deemed necessary to meet the changing needs of the College District.
5. Report to the Board as deemed necessary, or upon request of the Board, on the College District's educational activities, fiscal affairs, and any other College District activities.
6. Call meetings of the faculty and other employees as deemed necessary.
7. Investigate the needs of facilities for the College District and make such recommendations to the Board in order to meet these needs. Approve all architectural plans and specifications for presentation to the Board.
8. Be responsible for preparation of an annual budget for the College District. Submit the budget to the Board within the dates as prescribed by law.
9. Within the limits of the budget approved by the Board, have the power to approve requisitions for purchases and expenditures for the program of the College District, or delegate this authority to another member of the administration as deemed advisable.

10. Have ultimate control of the College District's fund raising activities.
11. Represent the College District to its constituency, the general public, and in educational groups.
12. Maintain amity and unity of purpose among all members of the faculty and administration, noninstructional employees, the Board, the alumni, and the College District's constituency.
13. Make final approval of all campus activities and official trips involving students and other personnel, or delegate this function to another administrative officer as deemed advisable.
14. Submit all official matters to the Board when their action is required, serving as the only official voice for communication with the Board. Request the administration to present certain information when necessary.
15. When action is urgently required in an area not covered by Board policy, have the power to act. Inform the Board promptly of such action, which shall be subject to review by the Board at its discretion.
16. Enter into various negotiations and agreements on behalf of the College District relating to financial, contractual, and community affairs.
17. Have ultimate responsibility for, and is authorized to exercise appropriate administrative and fiscal control over, the College District's intercollegiate athletic program.

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
