This course is an overview of the horticulture industry, plant science, terminology, classification, propagation, environmental responses and careers and opportunities in the field of horticulture. Tuition includes \$20 lab fee (96 hours).

Texas master Gardener Certification is a program for volunteers who take an active interest in lawns, trees, shrubs, flowers and gardens. Enrollment in this program is by application to the Henderson County Cooperative Extension office. This special training in horticulture sets them apart from other home gardeners and prepares the student for membership in the Henderson County Master Gardener organization. Master Gardeners are enthusiastic and willing to learn and help others by volunteering through the Cooperative Extension Office to provide horticultural related information to their communities. The type of service done by Master Gardeners varies according to community needs and the abilities and interests of the group. The Henderson County Extension Office and Horticulture Committee are partners with TVCC in offering this certification and will coordinate the volunteer work related to the program. This program will include both classroom hours and practicum hours. Students may register for the credit class (HALT1301.0476/HALT1301.0479) as well as through continuing Education. Books, supplies, and testing for certification are the responsibility of the student.

ORGANIC GARDENING AND FARMING

HALT1092(HALT3002)

A hands-on, how-to study of the basics of growing vegetables, farm crops, herbs and flowers without the use of pesticides and herbicides. The organic gardener grows in harmony with nature, utilizing and replenishing, natural resources to enrich the soil and resist disease and insects. The student will learn the most important techniques to healthy and sustainable growing as well as what to grow in our area and how to harvest and sell produce. Topics will include insects, compost, weed control, water, companion planting, design and propagation. Join the movement to eat locally and learn how to incorporate an edible landscape into your garden plan. The student should expect to pay an additional \$25-\$35 for tools which will be his/her own to keep. A list will be provided in class along with suggestions for where they may be purchased.
