# COSMETOLOGY



## OBJECTIVE...

It is the objective of Trinity Valley Community College to assist our students in becoming a professional cosmetologist by teaching the theory and basic skills necessary to successfully pass the state board examination. The student will be prepared for entry level employment as a cosmetologist.



## REGISTRATION...

Fall 2005 – August 23 & 24, 2005  
 Spring 2006 – January 10 & 11, 2006  
 Summer 2006 – May 24, 2006

This is a limited enrollment program. Students will be allowed to enroll on a “first come, first serve” basis according to the registration schedule.

## TUITION AND FEES...

Tuition and fees are payable at the time of enrollment. Tuition will be paid three (3) times during the year at Fall, Spring and Summer I Registration.

## COSMETOLOGY DEGREE PLAN...

This program will provide students with an opportunity to learn the basic manipulative and theoretical skills necessary to become a licensed cosmetologist. The program will provide for 1,500 hours of instruction scheduled on the basis of 7-1/2 hours per day, 5 days per week, to be completed within 12 months. Classes for cosmetology meet Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Dates for all holidays and breaks can be found in the college catalog in the yearly schedule.
