ABOUT THE COLLEGE:

Trinity Valley Community College was founded as Henderson County Junior College in late 1945 and early 1946. The first registration and 1946 summer classes were conducted in temporary facilities at Athens High School. Classes for the 1946 fall semester were moved to a dedicated property provided by the Board of Trustees which remains as our main campus in Athens. Beginning in 1969, the school became a multi-campus institution with the initiation of instructional programs at the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Coffield, Beto I, Powledge, and Michael units beginning in 1969. Additional campuses were established in Palestine, TX in 1972 and Terrell, TX in 1973. In 1983 the Health Science Center campus was opened in Kaufman, TX. In 1986, the Board of Trustees voted to rename the institution Trinity Valley Community College to better reflect the five county areas our campuses serve. In, November 2016, the governing board unanimously approved the purchase of the Old Renaissance Hospital building in Terrell, Tx to become the new Terrell Health Science Center. With the completion of renovations, classes began January 2020 in the new facility. Trinity Valley Community College has a proud heritage of service to our region and continues to support the needs of our community and student body.

Trinity Valley Community College's vision is to be a leader in providing quality education, innovative programs, and purpose for our students, employees, and communities. Our mission is to transform lives through affordable and accessible education. Trinity Valley Community College has a proud heritage of service to our region and continues to support the needs of our community and student body.

SIGNIFICANT POLICY CHANGES:

There are no significant changes in policy which impact this budget request

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE PROVISION OF SERVICES:

Trinity Valley Community College Workforce Education and Continuing Education Department introduced new programs for their students. Driving/Commercial Driver's License (CDL) training courses began in February 2022 and beginning in August 2022 the new Electrical Line Worker program will begin classes. This is a 22-week certification program which will help students in electric power generation, transmission and distribution. It is an expansion of the established Electrical Power and Transmission program.

SIGNIFICANT EXTERNALITIES:

The United States is experiencing the highest inflation rates since the 1980s. This will impact purchasing, employee salaries/hiring, and student finances and challenge schools such as Trinity Valley Community College to continue to serve our students at a level that benefits them so they can become strong contributors to our community.

Trinity Valley Community College was awarded a \$500,000 Texas Reskilling and Upskilling for Education (True) Institutional Capacity Grant. This grant allowed us to expand our Workforce Education program, beginning with the new Electrical Line Worker Program

BACKGROUND CHECKS:

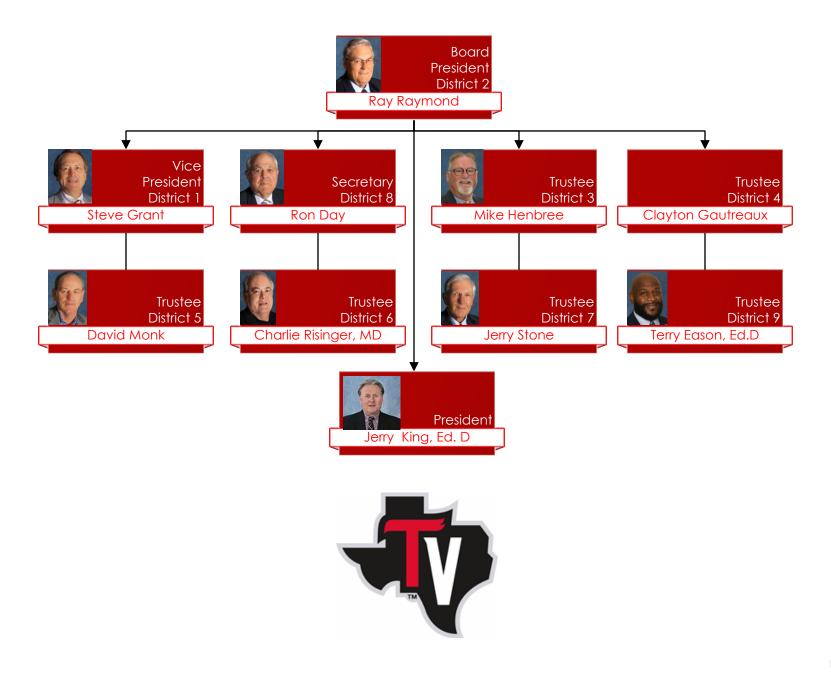
FORMULA FUNDING:

Trinity Valley Community College respectfully supports the \$2,029.8 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office, Budget Division. This request is based on the recommendations of the Formula Advisory Committee of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfil its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certificate, transfer, and degree programs. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the Building a Talent Strong Texas strategic plan. Expanded state investments in community colleges will support dual credit courses that give high school students an early start in postsecondary education; initiatives to recruit uncredentialed Texans and support them through graduation; and the creation and expansion of programs built on the skills necessary for gainful employment and Texas' continued economic growth.

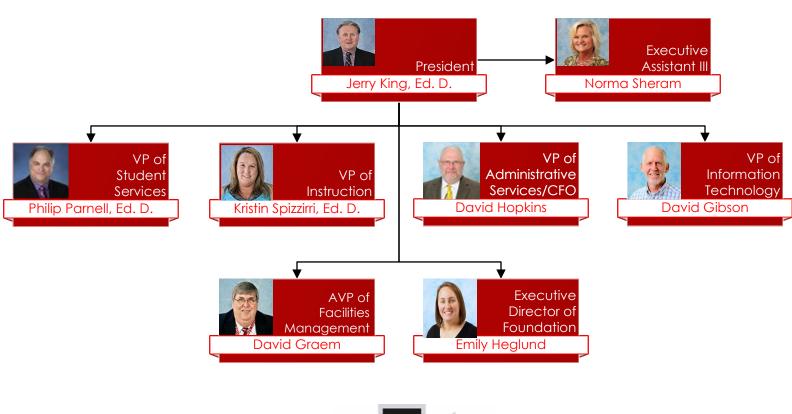
Trinity Valley Community College Organizational Chart
