## Faculty Association Agenda Meeting with Dr. King, Dr. Spizzirri, Dr. Parnell Friday, May 7, 2021

- I. I recommend that high school "observers" in our classes oversee their students more closely and communicate with us. Also, I would urge them to make sure these students know how to use Canvas. Also, I wish the Athletic Director would task someone with the job of checking on their athletes more closely. I don't care if they "observe" in my Canvas.
- I turned in a PO Request last week for paper for my big plotter. I used my Supplies Office budget. Somewhere along the way, someone changed it to Supplies Instructional. Now I have to move money to cover it. I would not have noticed it except for the fact I was checking everyone's accounts, including mine, for oddities.
  I think it should be that if someone changes an account number on a PO Request somewhere along the way, that fact should be relayed back to the requester and not left for them to discover on their own.

- v. I am returning to face-to-face classes in Fall 2021. I am fully vaccinated as are all of my immediate family members. COVID-19, according to science as of May 4, 2021, poses a very low risk for me and my family in terms of catching and transmitting it. 3. What measures does the college need to adopt to prevent liability for both the institution and their instructors?
