Having recently announced my pending resignation as Texas Commissioner of Higher Education, I concluded that this would be a good time to take stock of Texas public higher education after 15 years on the job.

Of course, any discussion of Texas public higher education must begin with a comment or two about Texas public K–12 education, given how dependent the former is on the latter. Simply put, a state system of higher education cannot flourish without a strong K–12 foundation. A glance through the early pages of this almanac reveals several areas of concern for Texas K–12. On SAT reading and writing, Texas ranks 42nd among the states; in math, we rank 41st. On the ACT, the second major national assessment of college readiness, Texas students do better, placing 27th among all states. Going by just these two assessments, somewhere between 25 percent and 40 percent of entering students are deemed not college ready. Texas allows multiple assessments for demonstrating college readiness, but even so, about 40 percent of entering college students are deemed not college ready.

Texas also lags other states in sending students to college directly from high school—52 percent compared to the national average of 67 percent. Texas college-going rates are especially low for males, particularly African Americans and Latinos. In 2018, males made up only 43 percent of total public higher education enrollment in Texas, a disparity that is approaching crisis status.

Not surprisingly, the students who are least likely to complete high school and enroll in college are poor. As the almanac notes, examining educational attainment in 8th grade cohorts shows that only 73 percent of poor students (defined as those qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch) will graduate high school and only 44 percent will enroll in higher education in Texas (compared to 84 percent and 65 percent, respectively, for their more affluent peers). Considering that 59 percent of all Texas public school students are economically disadvantaged students, a failure to significantly improve their educational attainment will have dire consequences for the economic well-being and quality of life in Texas.

Clearly, a much higher level of cooperation between K–12 and higher education is needed in Texas. Faculty teams from both sectors should work more regularly together to align curricula for both academic and career and technical education programs. Colleges and universities should expand and maintain strong professional development programs for high school teachers to enrich subject matter mastery and maintain appropriate levels of academic rigor. The proliferation of dual credit courses in recent years creates both an opportunity and an imperative for an unprecedented level of collaboration between faculty from the two sectors.

As data in the almanac starkly demonstrate, poorly prepared students who enroll in Texas colleges and universities are generally placed in developmental education, from which they typically do not emerge successfully. Only 28 percent of students placed in developmental math complete a college-level credit course in two years; in reading and writing, the numbers are 41 percent and 35 percent, respectively. In Texas community colleges, fewer than 22 percent of underprepared students complete either a degree or a certificate in six years; in universities, only 30 percent of underprepared students complete a postsecondary credential in the same time frame.

These are tough numbers that Texas must overcome if it is to reach the goals of 60x30TX. But there is ample justification for optimism. As I write this, the Texas legislature is considering major reforms for K–12 education: salary increases for teachers, expanded pre-K opportunities, and increasing resources for schools in low-income communities. These actions would significantly improve college readiness and encourage more high school graduates to enroll in our public colleges and universities.

Recent changes in state policy are also yielding promising results. Current state law overhauling the practice of developmental education has led to significant improvement in student performance, and the state adoption of performance-based funding for two-year institutions is raising retention rates, completion rates, and employment outcomes.

Our public institutions of higher education are showing signs that they are adjusting to the era of "post traditional" students, who are typically older, less affluent, and less familiar with the nuances of higher education than their predecessors. Colleges and universities are creating emergency aid programs for students who encounter unexpected expenses that might otherwise force them to drop out of college. Hunger is an increasingly important issue for today's college students, and institutions are responding by creating and maintaining food pantries that students can use at no cost.

The rising cost of higher education continues to trouble political and education leaders. Texas is making progress on this issue as well. The state and individual institutions are supporting the use of open educational resources, instructional materials that are either free or far less expensive than conventional textbooks. Institutions are focusing on reducing time to degree and the number of courses students take in pursuit of associate and bachelor's degrees. The issue of transferring course credits from one institution to another is receiving an unprecedented level of attention with the goal that all courses will transfer and count toward a degree. The Texas Affordable Baccalaureate (TAB) initiative, which adopts innovative educational practices and can deliver baccalaureate degrees for less than half the cost of conventional degrees, now includes 12 TAB programs currently being offered or in the development stage at eight institutions. The state continues to increase funding for the TEXAS Grant program, which places higher education within the reach of tens of thousands of students. While no one is pleased that the cost of higher education continues to rise, the facts are that our community colleges are the third most affordable in the country while our public universities are right at the national average. State institutions such as Texas A&M University and The University of Texas at Austin regularly appear on national lists of the best higher education bargains in the country. And Texas public universities have maintained affordability while improving their research and academic reputations. Texas now has eight public universities designated as Carnegie R1 Status research institutions: Texas A&M University, Texas Tech University, University of Houston, University of North Texas, The University of Texas at Austin, The University of Texas at Arlington, The University of Texas at Dallas, and The University of Texas at El Paso. Nationwide, only 86 public universities carry Carnegie R1 Status.

For all our challenges, Texas is on track to achieve the goals of *60x30TX*, although, at this moment, there is little margin for error. Texas must produce more college-ready high school graduates who enroll in higher education. Students need to complete their degrees in a more timely and efficient manner. Our colleges and universities must improve developmental education, hold down costs, and increase completions. And while public universities have been steadily improving six-year graduation rates, they remain lackluster at 62 percent statewide.

The most precious resource of any state is its young population, and Texas is projected to lead the nation in the growth of its school-age population over the next decade. It is Texas' most urgent priority to prepare our young people for leadership in a world where education—indeed lifelong education—will be all but indispensable for success.

One last note: It has been a privilege and a pleasure to serve as Commissioner of Higher Education in this great state.

General Terms

Age: Age is calculated by subtracting the individual's date of birth from the *begin date* of the reporting period. For fall, the begin date is September 1; for spring, January 1; and for summer, June 1.

At risk: Includes students who received a Pell Grant, graduated with a GED, were 20 years or older when they first entered college, started as a part-time student taking fewer than 12 hours, or had an SAT/ACT score less than the national average.

Fiscal year (FY): The state's fiscal year is similar to the academic year of institutions. The fiscal year runs from September 1 through August 31; for example, FY 2018 is September 1, 2017, to August 31, 2018.

Hispanic Serving (HS): Colleges, universities, or systems/districts in which Hispanic fall headcount enrollment constitutes a minimum

of 25% of the total fall headcount enrollment. (Percentage is consistent with Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities definition.)

Historically Black College or University (**HBCU**): Any historically black college or university established prior to 1964 whose principal mission was, and is, the education of black Americans.

Lower-division: Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with freshman and sophomore college students.

Native student: A student who began and graduated at the same institution.

Percentile: The score below which a certain percentage of observations fall. For example, the 25th percentile score is the score below

which 25% of the scores may be found, and the 75th percentile score is the score below which 75% of the scores may be found.

SAT/ACT test scores: Test score ranges are shown for Math and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing on the SAT test and for Math and English on the ACT test. Of enrolled full-time students, 50% have test scores within the ranges listed, 25% have scores above, and 25% have scores below. (*Source: USDOE IPEDS data for 2017–18, most recent data available*)

UG: Abbreviation for undergraduate.

Upper-division: Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with junior and senior college students.

60X30TX Strategic Plan Update

60x30TX, the state's strategic plan for higher education, is focused on student success and establishing a globally competitive Texas workforce by 2030. Achieving the goals of 60x30TX rests heavily on

collaboration among stakeholders in higher education, K–12 education, and the workforce. The plan addresses students' desires for a better life, employers' desires to remain competitive, and the state's need for a robust economy. Students of all backgrounds must complete certificates or degrees in larger numbers if the future workforce of Texas is to be globally competitive in 2030. Meeting that goal means increasing student success, addressing college affordability, and making explicit the workplace skills that students obtain in their programs.

60x30 is the overarching goal at the center of the plan, but the other three goals are what will get us to 60 percent in 2030. The completion goal counts the number of certificates and degrees conferred at Texas institutions. Data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics make clear that students do not get much of an economic lift from college attendance unless they complete a credential. Also, credential attainment ensures that students will gain full exposure to the skills available through academic programs, allowing them to effectively market these skills to secure employment that pays competitively. Affordable college programs and higher earnings position graduates to pay off their student debt. The debt goal aims to balance debt to help ensure that students have sufficient resources to complete their education but at levels that are feasible to pay back based on their career choice.

In 2018, the THECB continued to promote 60x30TX across the state. Each of the 10 higher education regions, in collaboration with K–12 and workforce stakeholders, developed strategies to help achieve their regional 60x30TX targets and identified institutional contributions toward regional targets. The THECB enhanced the 60x30TX.com website, the hub for the plan. This website provides resources about 60x30TX, including updated data that show progress toward plan targets and goals. The THECB continues to provide training to assist higher education institutions in implementing and achieving the 60x30TX marketable skills goal. In 2018, the agency revised marketable skills guidelines, developed a career readiness handbook, and hosted a second marketable skills conference.


60x30: Educated Population



60x30TX is founded on the critical need for Texas to produce an educated workforce that is able to adapt and compete at the highest levels. The world's most competitive workforces have younger populations with more education compared to the United States and compared to Texas. Currently, only 43.5 percent of Texans ages 25–34 have a postsecondary degree or certificate. The best-educated societies in the world are at or near 60 percent in this age group. To compete and excel in this environment, 60x30TX sets an ambitious goal of 60 percent postsecondary attainment for young adult Texans.





Texas needs to continue its record of generating impressive growth in undergraduate degree and certificate production at all colleges and universities—private, public, and for-profit.


With 60x30TX, Texas aims to award a total of 6.4 million certificates or degrees by 2030. The plan also sets targets for Hispanic, African American, male, and economically disadvantaged completers and seeks to increase the percentage of students who enroll in higher education directly after high school from the current 52.3 percent to 65 percent.

GOAL By 2030, at least 550,000 students in that year will complete a certificate, associate, bachelor's, or master's from an institution of higher education in Texas.

Marketable Skills



All programs develop skills of value in the marketplace. Students who can articulate their marketable skills are better positioned to get a suitable job. Every year, a national study by the University of California Los Angeles Higher Education Research Institute finds that more than 85 percent of surveyed students identified "getting a better job" as the most important reason for attending college. The *60x30TX* plan requires institutions to formally identify those skills of value for each of their degree programs by 2020 so that students can market themselves to future employers.

Institutions are making significant progress toward the 2020 target. A marketable skills process has been developed and implemented by 41 percent of institutions; 17 percent have developed the process but not yet fully implemented it.





Student Debt




As a state, Texas has paid increasing attention to balancing student loan debt and improving how higher education is financed to reduce financial barriers that students and families encounter when pursuing any level of higher education. One way to focus on student loan debt is to set the statewide goal of maintaining debt load as measured against student earning power at graduation. *60x30TX* sets the goal to keep this ratio at 60 percent for students with debt who graduate in the state. This goal has several facets: (1) the role of the state, (2) the role of institutions, and (3) the role of students. While


there will be variation by sector and by student, all undergraduates with student loan debt who complete a credential from a Texas public two- and/or four-year institution are included in the 60 percent calculation. This goal also includes a target that no more than half of undergraduates complete their credentials with student loan debt. In 2018, 45 percent of undergraduate students completed their degrees and certificates with student loan debt.

GOAL By 2030, undergraduate student loan debt will not exceed 60 percent of first-year wage for graduates of Texas public institutions.*



This page features information relevant to undergraduate debt for students who attended Texas public higher education institutions. Trend lines highlight the changes in tuition and fees compared to state appropriations over time—two key factors in determining affordability. Students who borrow but who do not complete, as highlighted in the 2012 cohort profile, have the burden of debt without the increased earnings potential of a degree. Also, as shown at the middle of the page, the average debt (for students with debt) and percentage of students with debt at Texas public universities differs considerably across institutions.








Student Loan Debt As a Percentage of First-Year Wage Percentage by race/ethnicity



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







Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity






Enrollment by Gender







Completion of 8th Grade Cohort (2007–18)

The data on this page highlight differences in high school graduation, college enrollment, and college completion rates by gender and economic status for students enrolled in grade 8 in the 2007–08 academic year. By 2018, 23 percent received a higher education credential. One percent of these students received a certificate, 5 percent received an associate degree, and 17 percent received a bachelor's degree or higher. Male students and economically disadvantaged students graduated from public high school and completed college at lower rates than their respective counterparts. While we must continue to strengthen the pipeline from middle school to high school and to and through higher education, the students captured by the 8th grade cohort analysis represent about one-third of all the completers in 2018. Students (63 percent) follow many pathways through secondary and postsecondary education; for example, some attend private Texas high schools, some take time off before enrolling in college, some attend part time, and some complete outside of a six-year window.



Of the 265,618 students who completed undergraduate credentials in 2018, about one-third were in the 8th grade cohort.




Two-Year College Transfer by Ethnicity

Percentage of the entering students in 2012 cohort who transferred within six years




Two-Year College Transfers to University by SCH Attempted

Percentage of the entering students in 2012 cohort who transferred within six years




FY 2018 Bachelor's Graduates with SCH at a **Two-Year College**







Developmental Education Profile

Almost 40 percent of students entering a Texas public institution do not meet one or more state college readiness standards. The majority of these students start at public community and technical colleges. Among those who are underprepared in math, reading, and/or writing, only 44-64 percent meet readiness standards within two years, and about 28-41 percent go on to complete a college-level course. With respect to completion of a degree or certificate within six years, underprepared students lag behind those who enter college ready in all subject areas. Fortunately, with developmental education reform efforts firmly in place, the outcomes for underprepared students have been improving steadily over the past five years, and more progress is expected given the fall 2018 implementation of co-requisite models statewide.








Entering Students Who Met College Readiness Standards



Students Who Were Not College Ready but Completed First College-Level Course within Two Years, by Subject










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








PERCENT STUDENT POPULATION BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Definitions, Data Years, and THECB Data Sources

The following definitions, data years, and data sources will help you navigate the data provided in this year's almanac. They are particularly helpful in reading the institutional profiles. For a more comprehensive list of data source references, see p. 4.

Accountability (Peer) groups: Texas public universities are grouped based on key indicators such as mission, number of doctoral-research/scholarship programs, and research expenditures. Public two-year colleges are grouped based on size and/or type.

Average tuition and fees: The cost of tuition and mandatory fees charged to a student taking 30 semester credit hours (SCH) (15 SCH in the fall and 15 SCH in the spring). For fouryear public institutions and the Lamar and Technical Colleges, tuition includes mandatory tuition (state-required tuition) and designated tuition (set by institutional governing boards). Submitted to the THECB on the College Student Budget Report. **FY 2019 rates**

Bachelor's graduates as a percentage of

undergraduate FTSE enrollment: The number of students who received an undergraduate degree from an institution in a given year divided by the annual full-time student equivalent (FTSE) enrollment. The FTSE enrollment is the total of all semester credit hours divided by 30 (the number of SCH considered full time for undergraduates annually). Dual credit enrollments are not included in FTSE. FY 2018

Debt:

Average student debt: For FY 2018 graduates, average student loan debt includes all identifiable debt prior to graduation for those students with debt. University graduates include those who received a bachelor's degree. Two-year institution graduates include those who received an associate degree or certificate.

- Native student debt: Average debt for students who graduated from the institution where they were enrolled as a first time in college (FTIC) student.
- Portion as parent debt: Portion of native students' debt that was incurred by a parent through a federal PLUS loan (2006–12) or a federal Direct PLUS loan (2010–current). All native students with debt are included in parent debt calculation.
- Transfer student debt: All identifiable average debt for students who graduated from an institution but were not first time in college (FTIC) at that institution.

Debt profile for 2012 cohort: For completers and non-completers, the average student loan debt includes identifiable debt up to graduation or through FY 2018. Students who were still enrolled (had not graduated by FY 2018) were included as non-completers. Identifiable debt: All undergraduate debt accumulated at Texas institutions as reported to the THECB, including federal and state loans, parent PLUS loans, and some private educational loans.

Percentage with debt: Percentage of an institution's graduates who incurred identifiable debt prior to graduation. **FY 2018**

Statewide student debt as a percentage of first-year wage: Median of individual student's identifiable debt to first-year wage percentage for students awarded a level I or II certificate, associate degree, or bachelor's degree from a Texas public institution. Individual must have student loan debt data at time of award and wages in first year following award. Bachelor's degrees awarded at community colleges are not included. Debt data for 2016 graduates. Wage data from 2017. (Source: Financial Aid Database System unemployment insurance [UI] wage records)

Degrees awarded/degrees and certificates awarded: For universities, the number of degrees awarded by race/ethnicity and level; certificates are not included. For two-year institutions, the number of degrees and certificates awarded by race/ethnicity. FY 2018

Developmental education:

College-level course completion: Percentage of total students below state readiness standards (called Texas Success Initiative [TSI]) in math, reading, and/or writing who successfully completed a college-level course in the related area (math, reading intensive, and/or writing intensive, as applicable) with a grade of A, B, or C within two years of college enrollment. *Fall 2015 cohort*

Total students below state standard: Students in college for the first time (both full and part time) who did not meet the state readiness standards in math, reading, and/or writing at the time of enrollment. *Fall 2015 cohort*

State readiness standard met: Percentage of total students below state readiness standards in math, reading, and/or writing who satisfied state standards within two years of college enrollment. *Fall 2015 cohort*

Dual credit:

Dual credit students: High school students who attempt one or more college courses for high school and college credit.

Dual credit as percentage of total enrollment: Dual credit enrollment as a percentage of the total enrollment. *Fall 2018*

Dual credit outcomes: College persistence and graduation rates for an institution's dual credit students who subsequently enrolled in the same or a different Texas college or university.

The percentage who earned a baccalaureate and/or associate degree is unduplicated. *Fall* 2013 first time in college (FTIC) cohort

Earnings of graduates: Annual wages of graduates during the first, third, fifth, eighth, and tenth year after graduation. Wage calculations include students who worked in Texas at least three-quarters of the year and did not earn a higher degree during the tracking period. No inflation factor was applied. For 2006 graduates, the wages are for 2008 (first year), 2010 (third year), 2012 (fifth year), 2013 (eighth year), and 2017 (tenth year). For 2016 graduates, the first-year wages were calculated for 2017.

Enrollment:

Fall headcount: The institutional fall headcount enrollment by race and ethnicity, including all full- and part-time students. Fall 2018

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) undergraduate enrollment: The sum of all fall undergraduate semester credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15. *Fall 2018*

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) total enrollment: The sum of all fall semester

credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15 for undergraduate SCH, 12 for master's and doctor's professional practice SCH, 9 for doctor's research/scholarship SCH, and 17 for optometry SCH. *Fall 2018*

Excess semester credit hours: Average number of semester hours (SCH) attempted by graduates of bachelor's degree programs from a Texas public institution in excess of the degree plan or graduates of associate degree programs in excess of 60 SCH. **FY 2018**

Faculty:

Total university faculty: All faculty members with teaching responsibilities, excluding teaching assistants. *Fall 2017*

University tenured/tenure track faculty: All faculty members with teaching responsibilities who have received, or are on a track to receive, tenure. *Fall 2017*

Two-year college faculty: Total number of faculty members and number and percentage of full-time (teaching 80% or more) faculty members. This includes faculty teaching flex courses. *Fall 2017*

First-time students accepted: Percentage of first-time summer/fall applicants accepted by the institution. *Fall 2018*

First-time undergraduates in Texas top 10%: The percentage of first-time undergraduates entering in the summer or fall class who ranked in the top 10% of their Texas public high school graduating class. *Fall 2018*

Except as noted in the almanac, the sources of data are the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board institutionally certified CBM data; most measures are available in the Texas Higher Education Accountability System.

PROFILES: 2-YEAR

Graduates' status/success:

Four-year graduates' employment/enrollment status: The percentage of graduates employed in the fourth quarter of the calendar year after graduation and/or enrolled in a Texas institution in the following fall after graduation. FY 2017

Two-year college graduates' employment/ enrollment status: The percentage of academic or technical graduates employed in the fourth quarter of the calendar year after graduation and/or enrolled in a Texas two- or four-year institution in the following fall after graduation, as specified. FY 2017

Graduation rates:

Public university 4-, 6-, and 10-year rates: The percentage of first-time entering, degree-seeking students who graduated with a bachelor's degree or higher from the same institution or another Texas public or independent institution after 4, 6, and 10 academic years for two groups: those students who enrolled in their first fall as full-time students (taking 12 or more semester credit hours [SCH]) and those who enrolled part-time (taking fewer than 12 SCH). **Rates through FY 2018** (for fall 2014, 2012, and 2008 cohorts, respectively)

Public two-year college 3-, 4-, and 6-year rates: The percentage of first-time, credentialseeking undergraduates who graduate within 3, 4, or 6 academic years for two groups: those students who enrolled in their first fall as full-time students (taking 12 or more semester credit hours [SCH]) and those who enrolled part-time (taking fewer than 12 SCH). Both degrees and certificates are included. *Rates through FY 2018* (for fall 2015, 2014, and 2012 cohorts, respectively)

Developmental education/non-developmental education rates: The percentage of first-time, full-time, credential-seeking undergraduates who graduated after six academic years by whether they met or did not meet state readiness standards in one or more areas under the Texas Success Initiative (TSI).

Percentage of graduates completing 30 SCH at a two-year college: The percentage of university graduates who took 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) at two-year public institutions. FY 2018

Students receiving Pell:

Percentage of students receiving Pell Grants/ received Pell in current year: The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled in the fall semester who received a Pell Grant for the current academic year. *Fall 2017*

Ever received Pell in higher education: The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled in the fall semester who received a Pell Grant at any time since 1997. **Fall 2017** **Ever received Pell and within two years of graduation:** The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled in the fall semester with a classification of junior or senior at a four-year institution or sophomore or above at a twoyear institution who received a Pell Grant at any time since 1997. **Fall 2017** (Source for Pell Grant data: Financial Aid Database System)

Race/ethnicity: In addition to African American, Hispanic, and White, the following race/ethnicity categories are included.

International student: A person who is not a citizen or permanent resident of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. It may also refer to a non-resident alien.

Other: All other races not individually listed, including Native Hawaiian, other Pacific Islander, American Indian, Native Alaskan, Asian, multiracial not including African American, or unknown origin.

Research expenditures: Total expenditures from federal, state, private, and institutional sources combined, as reported in the annual research expenditures report. **FY 2018**

Research expenditures per T/TT faculty

FTE: Total of federal and non-profit research expenditures per tenured/tenure-track (T/TT) full-time faculty member equivalent (includes only faculty members with teaching responsibility). **FY 2018** (research expenditures), **Fall 2017** (T/TT faculty FTE)

Restricted research expenditures:

Expenditures contracted, gifted, or granted by an external entity (such as government agencies, philanthropic organizations, or individuals) where the primary use must be research or development. The Coordinating Board collects restricted research expenditures for formula distribution of Research Development Funds (RDF) and as a criterion for the National Research Universities Fund (NRUF). However, restricted research expenditures are more narrowly defined here than in the Annual Financial Reports (AFR) and thus not comparable. Estimates for restricted research expenditures for institutions not participating in RDF or NRUF are research expenditures minus stateappropriated funds, institutional funds, and indirect cost. FY 2018

Revenue per FTSE: Revenue, excluding auxiliary and public service funds, divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE) by categories, including total revenue, tuition and fees, state appropriation, federal funds, and institutional funds. Tuition and fees is the net of scholarship discounts and allowances. **FY 2018** Student/faculty ratio: Full-time student equivalents (FTSE) divided by full-time equivalent (FTE) teaching faculty. For FTE teaching faculty, faculty reported on CBM008 must match CBM004 to be included in calculation. *Fall 2017*

Time and SCH to degree: The average length of time in years and number of attempted semester credit hours (SCH) to complete an associate degree (for two-year institutions) or a bachelor's degree (for four-year institutions) for students who graduated in FY 2018. Students are tracked 10 years back for accumulation of semester credit hours and total years and months that have elapsed from the first date of entry. Dual credit and developmental education hours are excluded. (*Note: Dual credit hours were included in these measures prior to the 2014 almanac.*)

Transfers to a senior institution:

Cohort: Number of students entering higher education for the first time at a two-year public institution who were not concurrently enrolled at a four-year institution. *Fall 2012 cohort*

Transfer rate: The percentage of students in the cohort who transferred to a senior institution within six years. Fall 2012 cohort through FY 2018

Two-year college students at universities:

Baccalaureate graduates who completed SCHs at two-year public colleges: Percentage of baccalaureate graduates who completed 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) at twoyear public colleges. FY 2018

Graduation of two-year college students: Percentage of undergraduates who were firsttime transfer students from Texas two-year public colleges with 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) in the six years prior to transferring and who graduated from the same Texas public university within four years. Statewide Transfer Graduation Rate shown on p. 15 includes all transfer students from Texas two-year public colleges with one or more SCH. **FY 2018**

Uses of funds per state-funded FTSE:

Operating expenses divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE). Operating expenses are broken out by total; instruction, research, and academic support; student services and scholarships; institutional support and operations and maintenance (OM) of plant; and other expenses (e.g., capital outlays from current fund sources). **FY 2018**
