


COMMUNITY COLLEGE SURVEY OF STUDENT ENGAGEMENT (CCSSE) ANALYSIS

- 2013 shows slight improvement over 2011, but TVCC improvement is less than the national improvement for Academic Challenge
- Instructor Perception for Academic Challenge reflects 2013 regaining a good portion of the 2011 loss
- 2011 CCSSE results showed shocking decline in student engagement
- 2007 and 2009 results showed steady improvement
- Baseline survey was in 2005



 - Support for Learners (7 Survey Questions)







2011-2013 CCSSE Benchmark Comparison (TVCC/National)
